- *Death Penalty Curriculum for "Tweens": "Forgive ... and Forget?"*: Middle school youth, while always desiring forgiveness themselves for their transgressions, find it a greater challenge to forgive others when they have been hurt. In the session "Forgive ... and Forget?" we explore this challenge in the lives of young people. Through prayer and Scripture (Matthew 18:21-35, "The Parable of the Unforgiving Servant"), small and large group discussion participants will be guided through the Catholic Church's teaching on capital punishment through the lens of forgiveness. ### Restorative Justice Workshops

- *Restorative Justice Workshop for Adults*: CMN is proud to announce its Restorative Justice Introductory workshop. - *Restorative Justice Workshop for High School Teens (Funded by Our Sunday Visitor Institute)*: This workshop – shared through the lens of John 8:1-11 ("The Woman Caught in Adultery") – leads youth through a process of role-play and relationship-building designed to help participants experience issues from different perspectives. Through relationship we learn how to approach one another with mercy and compassion. Entering into the circle of another's experience – both victim and offender – helps promote a sense of empathy and respect through which understanding and healing can take place.
